We are looking for a dedicated and passionate individual to join us in empowering communities and inspiring conservation action in the Tsavo Landscape and working closely with African Wildlife Foundation (AWF)

Position: Conservation Education Officer

Position Overview: In liaison with the senior Manager, the Conservation Education Officer will be responsible for planning, developing and implementing conservation education programs aimed at raising awareness and fostering a culture of conservation among local communities.

Key Responsibilities for this role will include:

- Developing engaging and informative conservation educational materials and resources
- Delivering conservation education sessions, learning activities, workshops and trainings to schools, community groups and other stakeholders
- Conduct WCK membership drive for schools, corporates, associates and community groups,
- Collaborating with local schools, community leaders and partner organizations to promote conservation education initiatives
- Monitoring and evaluating the impact of the conservation education programs and activities
- Contributing to the development of conservation education strategies and models
- Coordinate the assessment of schools and dissemination of conservation education
- Contribute in the identification of model schools and their development
- Facilitate the teachers and communities training workshops
- In collaboration with the Mobile Education Officer, carry out school visits within the project Geo-Scope
- Prepare progress reports and any other report as may be required
- Collaborate with the communications and ICT personnel for impactful stories and documentaries
- Contribute to the development and implementation of land use plans through schools and community mobilization
- Support and guide schools to implement nature-based conservation projects

- Maintain a good working relationship with the various stakeholders i.e local authorities, local communities, partners and all learning institutions within the project's Geo-scope.

Requirements:

- Bachelor's degree in environmental science, conservation biology, or related field
- A minimum of 5 years' proven working experience in *conservation or environmental education* field
- Must have knowledge of conservation education issues
- Must have strong project management and organizational skills, with the abilities to manage multiple tasks and deadlines
- Must be proficient in communication and presentation skills
- Should be excellent in data collection, analysis and report writing
- Must have the ability to engage and inspire diverse audiences, including children and adults
- Should be conversant with the local conservation issues and cultural context
- should be creative, enthusiastic and a passionate about conservation initiatives
- Must have the ability to work effectively in a multicultural and interdisciplinary team environment
- Must be proficient in computer applications, digital marketing and social media tools
- Should be fluent in English and Swahili, additional local languages will be a plus
- Should be able to drive and in possession of a valid driver's license
